

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
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Welcome Aboard!

TAEA WELCOMES FRIDAY KEYNOTE SPEAKER REGINALD ADAMS



Reginald C. Adams is a true visionary in the world of public art and community development. He is a master at creating public art projects that not only beautify neighborhoods but also bring people together and instill a sense of pride in their communities.

For the past 30 years, Reginald has been dedicated to designing, coordinating, and producing public art projects in Houston and beyond. He has collaborated with over 50,000 youth volunteers, hundreds of artists, and thousands of community stakeholders to create pieces that reflect the culture, heritage, history, and social context of the communities they serve.

One of Adams' most notable projects is the Absolute Equality-Juneteenth Mural Project, which gained national exposure and recognition for its powerful commemoration of the Juneteenth holiday. His work has been featured in prestigious publications such as The New York Times, The Washington Post, NPR, Entrepreneur, and other national media outlets.

Reginald's impact extends beyond creating beautiful art. He is a Senior Fellow with the American Leadership Forum (ALF) Class 24 and Community Development Class 1, an alumnus of Leadership Houston, a graduate of the Center for Houston's Future 2013, and a Past-President of the Rotary Club of Houston Skyline. His contributions to the community have been recognized by the Mayor of Houston, who proclaimed September 4, 2014, as Reginald Charles Adams Day.

Reginald's passion lies in using art to bring people together and make the world a more beautiful place.

Inside the Studio

Reginald will begin the workshop utilizing the therapeutic benefits of sound baths to inspire and energize participants. Each educator will contribute semi-precious stones, gems, crystals, shells, found objects, and personal mementos to the artwork. Reginald will work alongside participants to create a beautiful mosaic mandala mural that reflects the collective efforts and creativity of the workshop participants.

My name is David Maldonado, also known as CAPDAVJON, a moniker derived from "Captain Davey Jones." Initially just my username, the name unexpectedly stuck with my journey as a professional artist. I am a Mexican – American visual artist and creative based out of Houston, Tx. My artistic approach is rooted in storytelling, utilizing creativity as the vehicle to craft narratives. Whether it is igniting inspiration or conveying the essence of a team my goal is to captivate audiences through the medium of art. Muralists have long been a profound influence on my work. Public art serves as a communal voice, transcending barriers of language and social status. It is an inclusive art form, extending invitations to all, regardless of experience. I find immense joy in my work, painting murals, designing and teaching workshops with the youth in my community. Each project offers a chance to deepen my understanding of others, a privilege I hold dear. Striving for excellence, I aim to inspire others to pursue their dreams with unwavering dedication and passion.

David's workshop will be a collaborative painting session. Participants will be working on 2-3 large canvases. Participants will be put in groups. Groups of participants will take turns adding to the canvas. The canvas will come together to make a much larger composition.

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

PARTICIPATION

- **Purpose:** Alien sculptures will be part of the TAEA ART and SOUL AUCTION, and proceeds will be donated to the Galveston Ronald McDonald House.
- Theme: Alien Invasion let your imagination soar with extraterrestrial designs!
- TAEA members from across Texas are eligible to participate, including those from schools within Harris County, Fort Bend County, Brazoria County, Galveston County, and beyond.
- Participants must arrange for the delivery of their sculptures to the conference within the designated time frames (see intake).
- You may submit Alien sculptures based on district student enrollment as follows:
 - 25,000 or more: 2-8 sculptures
 - 10,000 25,000: 2-6 sculptures
 - Less than 10,000: 1-3 sculptures
- Dimensions: Minimum 3 feet in height
- Weight: no more than 50 lbs
- Must have a sturdy base for support

The Paper Square Challenge

Lesson Plan for Grades 3-12









Prep: Cut brightly colored paper into 2" squares



Experiment: Find as many ways as possible to alter squares, using just glue and scissors.



Assemble: Glue the altered squares in a quilt-like pattern for display.

How many ways can you alter a simple scrap of paper?

Armed with only a glue stick, scissors, and perhaps a tool or two, students can fold, cut, pierce, punch, crumple, curl, bend, shred, roll, twist, weave, tear, layer, emboss, and deboss one square after another.

Located at 2310 Sealy, Rosenberg Library is the only public library on Galveston Island and is the oldest continuously run library in the state of Texas. The Rosenberg Library architecture is a blend of two eras. The original building was finished and dedicated on June 22, 1904, the birthday of its patron, Henry Rosenberg. The library Museum maintains and exhibits artifacts that document the history of Galveston and the Republic of Texas, as well as the library's fine art collection. This will be a private tour group for TAEA participants. Look forward to taking a tour, exploring the behind-the-scenes art storage room and participating in a talk on how to use works of art to deepen student's understanding of history. Snacks will

The project has played a key role in the renaissance of the Strand, a National Historic Landmark District with many Victorian-era buildings, which has become a major tourist attraction. 


